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Medical-Welfare System Caring for People with Severe Intellectual Handicapps in Japan

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Abstract

The purpose of this paper is to summarize a historical perspective of social-welfare for Japanese with a severe intellectual handicap and to present the major characteristics of the care system at hospitals-homes in Japan as compared with the system in Denmark. In addition this paper describes Japan's unique system for the care of "Jusho-shinshin-shogai-ji" (people with a severe physical and mental handicap). This includes its history and functions, particularly the important role of hospital-homes as community-based centers. Also, we propose a plan for the role of a community-based medical-welfare system for the severely intellectually handicapped based on the concept of "normalization". Introduced is a model for community-based care of "Jusho-shinshin-shogai-ji" in a city of one million people.
